
TOP SPORTING EVENTS THIS MONTH

Upcoming & Current Events



Oxford and Cambridge line up on Saturday for the 157th University Boat Race with the score since the inaugural event in 1829 running at 80-75 in favour of the Light Blues. This is 4 miles and 374 yards of pure pain in front of 250,000 spectators who line the Tideway from Putney Bridge to Mortlake. Oxford won the toss and chose Surrey last year only to be beaten by four seconds at the finish. But what will the river throw at them this year?

Wales host England at the Millennium Stadium for this Euro 2012 qualifier. The big news from the England camp is John Terry's reinstatement as captain at the expense of the injured Rio Ferdinand whilst other notable absences include those of Steven Gerrard out following a groin operation and Theo Walcott with ankle trouble. Wales however have Gareth Bale and Aaron Ramsey fit for this 69,000 sell out event.

Bet on Wales v England now!



Having finished third in Group B England meet 1996 winners Sri Lanka in this World Cup quarter final with key players Pietersen, Broad, Shahzad and Yardy all out through injury or illness. Andrew Strauss' side have a good record against their opponents having won 6 out of eight World Cup encounters but lost the last in 2007 by two runs. The winner will meet New Zealand won yesterday.

Bet on Sri Lanka v England now!



The 2010 F1 season went to the wire with Sebastien Vettel sealing victory in Abu Dhabi in the final race of the year and the the 2011 season promises to be just as dramatic. One notable absence will be that of Robert Kubica following his rallying accident but Mark Webber, Fernando Alonso, Lewis Hamilton and Jenson Button will all be in the chase.

Bet on the Australian Grand Prix now!



The beautiful Augusta National is the venue for the 2011 Masters where historically players from the USA have had the lion's share of success with 56 wins since it's inauguration in 1934. This great tournament hasn't seen a European winner since Jose Maria Olazabal in 1999 but with the current top four players in the world coming from this side of The Pond, the green jacket might just hang on European shoulders this time.

Bet on The Golf Masters now!



The first winner of this great race was a horse called Lottery in 1839 and sometimes picking the winner out can be exactly that. Aintree's four miles and four furlong Grand National course contains 39 notorious fences such as The Chair, Beechers Brook, and the famous Foinavon fence which allowed this eventual 100-1 winner to break free to win. £520,000 goes to the winner at a course where legends are made and hopefully they all come back in one piece.

I feel like this is my first proper rant.

How can a company like Betfair be down on a Saturday afternoon? Worst of all this isn't the first time.



I can honestly say of all the bookies I've used online I can't remember any being unavailable unless maintenance was due.

I work in IT so know about the importance on having fail over systems and redundancy plans.

If I'm perfectly honest I don't want to even hear the excuses, I haven't even read the explanation because quite simply its unacceptable.

Where are Betfair's backup plans?

I'm sure everyone was frustrated and it's easier to swallow when you horses flop.

My problems were

- Kingscroft got up and won which would have meant I'd have achieved my profit for the day and got out.
- One of my strategies was in **staking** mode so lost a chunk of my account that would have been recovered
- I'm normally out Saturday afternoons chasing a football around but injury meant I could actually enjoy a race or two

However Betfair spoiled my afternoon fun and wasted a lot of my time after I'd loaded up all my bots for the day.

What about my backup plans?

Well Betdaq is a possibility but my bots are fixed to my Betfair account in all honesty I didn't have the time to set them all up again.

What about the alternatives?

Will people now turn to Betdaq or wbx possible I personally haven't used them for a while so I'm not too sure how liquidity compares now days. Maybe someone can fill me in.

I think people will certainly ensure they have accounts and the funds in preparation now considering this is not the first time Betfair have had issues.

Those who trade specifically will need a means to get out of those trades they've got started. So that's my frustrations released a bit.

Pro Betfairtrading – Introduction

Hello Inspectors,

Pro Betfair Trading is a selection system that is delivered via a PDF. It was developed by two professional punters, Michael and Alfred. According to the introduction this is how they select the horses to bet on.

The system is quite simple to apply, although it does assume that you know the basics like how to place wagers in Betfair. The PDF is 19 pages long, and can be yours for £69.99. There is no offer of a selection service.

Pro Betrair Trading is offered as a system to make a profit on horse races in the UK. The selection process requires you to watch the current market from about 10 minutes before each race, and typically wagers are made well before the off.

The staking plan maximizes the probability of making a profit on every selection, and something like 70% to 80% should be 'green screen'.

The nine steps are all simple and rather straightforward, however be prepared to read the instructions a couple of times to fully understand what is meant. The guide also has information on hedging bets for those that aren't sure about this, and it gives links to some trading bots – some either free or with free trials.

This trial will last for at least 56 trading days, and if it looks like it will be a successful strategy then the trial will be extended for a total of 84 days.

Pro Betfair Trading was trialed a few months ago, and due to personal reasons the Inspector involved had to end early. This trial will start from the beginning, without reference to the earlier trial except to say that the indications are that the trial is likely to be for the full 84 days.

For those who don't know me, here is a short introduction: I am not - at the moment - a professional punter, though I have been a semi-pro in the past. I've also twice written computer systems that selected at least 5 winners from 8 races.

My main claim to fame for this role is that I have professionally tested software and systems, making sure that they either do or do not follow the requirements. My interest in a new system is that it either does or does not work "out of the box". When I buy a system I want it to perform just like the advert says, then as I get used to it I can tweak the rules to suit me. That's how I will approach my reviews – according to the systems rules, and so you can be sure that you will get the results you expect.

Period of Reviews

Some debate has been going on as regards the length of time that services should be reviewed on Lay The Odds and Betting System Truths. A decision has been made, by our admin, Gordon!

- 1. If the product is "busy" i.e. there are normally selections every day, we go for the initial 56 day review, as currently, and then make a decision as to whether to continue or not. For these products we adopt a 56 "betting days" policy, so any day with no selections, for whatever reason, is not counted.
- 2. If the product is not busy, a "slow burner" as I call them, we will adopt a different policy. If it is obvious that there are only going to be one or two betting days per week, then we go straight to a full 84 day review. In this case it is just 12 weeks. However I think we will leave the option open for the reviewer to choose to go for 84 "betting Days" should they choose.

The idea is that the longer the review, and the more bets we can include, the better that is for everyone, readers, vendors, authors alike.
